Post Hearing Comments by the National Milk Producers Federation to the U.S. Trade Representative's Office Regarding Enforcement of U.S. WTO Rights in Large Civil Aircraft Dispute USTR-2019-0003 May 28, 2019

With these comments, the National Milk Producers Federation (NMPF) submits replies to requests for additional information posed to our organization during the May 15th hearing on the Enforcement of U.S. WTO Rights in Large Civil Aircraft Dispute (USTR-2019-0003).

We appreciated the opportunity to testify at this month's hearing on this important issue. In order to help further inform USTR's decision-making on appropriate retaliatory measures, should they be required in this case, please find below our responses to the two requests for further specifics. We would be happy to provide any additional information on the matters below, those covered by our earlier full written submission or other related questions.

1. Why is NMPF requesting extra lines be added when the list already has so many dairy ones?

The USTR list included 45 lines for dairy products. The EU imported less than \$5 million of products under 16 of these lines during calendar year 2018 and no imports under another 16 of these lines that year, leaving only 13 lines for which EU imports were in excess of \$9 million during calendar year 2018. In our testimony, NMPF indicated that it placed a priority on including those lines from the list for which dairy imports from the EU have been significant, in order to provide a more effective means to resolve the basic dispute, while also recommending the inclusion of the other dairy lines as a safeguard against import diversion from increased tariffs on lines with significant EU trade.

To complement this, NMPF recommended the inclusion of five additional dairy lines for which EU imports were in excess of \$10 million during calendar year 2018, in order to increase the number of dairy lines under which EU imports have been significant. So the answer to the question is that NMPF is suggesting that 5 dairy lines with significant imports from the EU be added to the 13 dairy lines in this category that are already on the list, all for the purpose of a providing a more effective means to resolve the basic dispute.

2. Additional information regarding how US or non-EU suppliers can meet the needs of the U.S. market if tariffs are increased on the recommended EU dairy goods.

The table below shows, for the 18 dairy lines that show significant imports from the EU and on which NMPF places priority for inclusion in the list:

- Imports from the EU-28,
- Imports from non-EU countries in calendar year 2018, and
- Calendar year 2018 production in the United States of similar or closely corresponding products.

As shown in the table, coverage of import volumes from the EU by imports from other countries and U.S. production is many-fold for these 18 dairy lines.
